On a foggy January morning in the Robert Kuntz Building garage, Cybersecurity students, members of the Multicultural Club and Mass Communication students were given white markers two at a time. Sitting in front of a Bismarck State College backdrop was a steel beam adorned with names. This was an opportunity for these students to add theirs.

The steel beam is intended to be the final one installed for the Polytechnic Facility, which is under construction on campus. To memorialize the progress being made, students, staff and faculty were invited to write their names on the beam. While some did add their own names, Veronica Bohrer, a BSC alumna, chose to add someone else's name.

"I like the idea of having my daughter's name on there —she's due in January," Bohrer said.

The new Polytechnic Facility broke ground in November 2022 and has been under construction

since. According to promotional materials for the beam signing, this is a chance for students to become a part of history—the final beam with all of its signatures will be visible in the new building.

"I've only been here for one and a half years," Kexin Zhou, a second year student said. "I'm very excited to have my name stay in that new building."

The wider student population was invited to sign their names on Jan. 29 and 30, when they could also submit their names to win winter-themed BSC swag bags from the school in a drawing. The BSC Polytechnic Facility's grand opening is scheduled for May 2025.

## BSC STUDENT GOVERNMENT UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP

The former President of the Student Government Association (SGA), Christopher Torres, was charged with attempted murder as well as discharge of a firearm within city limits and taken into custody around 1 a.m. on Dec. 10. The preliminary hearing for this case, which was originally scheduled for Jan. 17, has been rescheduled for March 25.

This situation had left the SGA without a president. Gracie Muggli, a Medical Laboratory Technician major and former SGA vice president, has since taken over the presidential role.

"When the current president doesn't return the next semester, the vice president automatically becomes the new president," Muggli said. "Before I was vice president, I was the Communication Committee chairwoman. SGA has 3 committees, Communications, Finance, and Student Affairs."

The SGA has since been moving forward with their goals for the semester.


I come from a small town named Hazen, N.D. My family lived on a country property, though I am

As your new coordinator I am currently revamp-





- 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup chicken stock (or veggie broth) Cream to serve (optional)
- Olive oil

Seasonings (optional)

Preheat Oven to 425 degrees F

Cut the tomatoes, onions, garlic and pepper into quarters and place on a baking sheet

Drizzle with olive oil and add any seasonings if you so choose

Bake for 25 minutes or until browned (to add more flavor broil the tops for an additional





## THE BIG 12 CONFERENCE PLAY PREVIEWED

The chaos of the college basketball season has entered the conference play period, with the Big 12 looking to provide viewers with shocking excitement.

The Big 12 conference has been producing some of the most wild games and upsets for a few years now. The conference has produced a Final Four team in six of the last seven NCAA Tournaments with Kansas being the most recent Big 12 program to win a National Title.

The conference added Houston, Cincinnati, Brigham Young (BYU) and Central Florida (UCF) during the summer of 2023. This move expanded the conference from 10 to 14 teams and changed the league's schedule format. Each team will play a total of 18 regular season conference games by facing five opponents twice and the other eight opponents once. The expansion and new schedule format has made this conference the most exciting to watch.

The Big 12 has shown that each game will be a battle and every team can win any given night. This was proven in just the second conference game for Houston on Jan. 9. Houston entered the game ranked second overall in the country with a 14-0 record, the last undefeated team in division one, and got handed their first loss by a determined Iowa State team.

I split up the conference into three groups. The first group is "Contending Pending" and contains two teams that are legit contenders for the National Championship. Kansas and Houston have been sitting atop the college basketball landscape for quite some time now. Each year they are consistently seeded highly in the Big Dance and both squads look like they will be continuing that trend this year.

I labeled the second group "Elevating Excellence" because each team in this group could make a deep run in March. This is a cluster of eight teams that could be very dangerous if they improve on their major defects. Baylor, Oklahoma, Texas Christian (TCU), Texas and BYU have great offenses but need significant improvement on the defensive end. December. Fortunately, senior Kerwin Walton replaced Cambridge's starting role and has upgraded his game since.

The four teams left are "Storms of Surprise" due to the risk of playing these schools. Cincinnati, Oklahoma State, UCF and West Virginia are all capable of pulling off wild upsets against every team in the conference. These teams may not have great starts to their season, but they are not an easy opponent. Cincinnati made that clear when they traveled across the country and beat 18th ranked BYU by double digits on Jan. 6.

## **MYSTICS ADJUST TO HARDWOOD HURDLES**

The Bismarck State College women's basketball season has surpassed its halfway point. The season tipped off with a roster featuring many new faces. Head coach, Thai Haggin, had only three players return from the 2022-23 team. Given the limited college basketball experience, the team has relied on the development of the freshmen.

"Last year we graduated a lot of sophomores," Haggin said. "This year we brought in nine freshmen and [they] are a big part of what we're doing right now." In the 2022-23 season, BSC was led by a sophomore scoring tandem. This year, the freshman forwards have filled two of the top three scoring positions. The rookie duo of Harys Beauchamp and Brynnlee Murdock are both shooting over 34% from the field and they combine for over 20 points a game.

"They had to come in and fill those positions," Haggin said. "They've done a really good job taking on challenges."

The Mystics had a 16-win season last year, securing them a third-place finish in the Mon-Dak Conference. However, they have faced some early season troubles with a 3-15 start. Haggin has counted on the sophomores to be leaders not just on but also off the court.

"Our three sophomores are phenomenal [leaders] and are very seasoned," Haggin said. "They were here for a year, they know the expectation, but they also want that expectation to go into these freshmen so that next year they can be leaders."

Even with the rough start, Haggin noted that she has seen so much team growth since the beginning of the season. She wants the growth and player development to continue advancing as the season moves along. "In college sports there's a process. When you're young there's a process," Haggin said. "[Our] goal is to keep improving so that when you're at the end of your season you achieve those goals."

The Mystics rank first in defensive efficiency in the Mon-Dak Conference. Haggin said that is where they have had the most improvement. She says the girls are really starting to understand how to play team defense.

The adversity from this season has been a learning opportunity for not just the players but the coaches too. Haggin has had to adapt to a different coaching style, but she says it has helped improve her coaching.

"Coaches always reflect and have to change the style of how [they] coach team to team," Haggin said. "Teams ultimately need to be coached differently and each individual needs to be coached a certain way. I've had to change the ways that I present material and to me that's an improvement on [myself]."


