

The Mystician Restarts Old Project

Exactly 30 years ago, Volume 1 Issue 2 of The Spectator was released. Four issues per academic year were realeased back then as a supplement in The Mystician.

The Spectator will now stand alone as a special edition of The Mystician at the end of the fall and spring semesters.

The Spectator ran for three academic years: 1977-1978, 1978-1979 and 1979-1980. It never made it to Volume 4 – until now.



The new Mission Statement of The Spectator, found below, is a slightly revised version of the original editor's note from Volume 1 Issue 1, which is dated Oct. 26, 1977.

A bit of irony, which is rather fascinating: When finalizing this publication with the printer and later glancing in the archives from 1977, I realized that it was thirty years ago to the day that Volume 1 Issue 2 of The Spectator was released – Dec. 5, 1977.

By reigniting this flame, which burnt out 27 years ago – it is my hope that it will bring joy to students for many decades to come.

The Mystician and The Spectator are important to BSC's history. Nothing else documents the year to year events like these publications. History is more often than not forgotten about; therefore, it is my goal to prevent that from happening at BSC.

The demise of the then "Bismarck Junior College 'Jay-Cee-An" resulted in a publication supplement inside the 1977 Mystician. At that time, The Spectator was not designed to replace the BJC Jay-Cee-An yearbook.

Due to the yearbook dying and The Spectator fading away, this new version of The Spectator shall serve as documentation of Bismarck State College students throughout the year.

The Spectator ran for three academic years: 1977-1978, 1978-1979, and 1979-1980. Dec. 5, 2017, Volume 4 Issue 1 of The Spectator was released.










2017 Lady Mystic Volleyball
